Neilsen Scholarship Program Going Strong - Craig H. Neilsen Foundation



Printed E-tattoo Ink-credible at Reading Brainwaves

"Researchers developed a conductive ink that can be printed directly on the surface of a patient's head and measure their brainwaves.... These e-tattoos could transform brain-computer interfaces, which use the same equipment as EEG, making them easier to deploy in daily activities and less obtrusive for the user.

Brain-computer interfaces allow people to control devices with just their

thoughts. This technology can help people with cognitive impairments live better lives. In recent years, Millán has used brain-computer interface technology to develop a brain-powered wheelchair ..."

Adaptive tricycle provides fun, motivating activity for improving leg strength, balance, fitness, and endurance. Now Michelle can zoom around right alongside her friends on a tricycle that's as cool and colorful as anything on the sidewalk.

Ernest, age 44, is living with cervical spinal cord injury and paraplegia following a gunshot wound. His social worker requested that NAF provide tracheostomy equipment and supplies. Ernest's insurance plan did not provide these essential supplies.


